

Lush & wild landscape wins Chelsea silver medal

At this year's RHS Chelsea Flower Show, leading independent UK landscaping company Indoor Garden Design collaborated with two leading garden designers to create a volcanic-themed spa garden, inspired by the breath-taking beauty and exotic majesty of the Canary Islands.

Garden Designer, Ethnobotanist and BBCTV presenter James Wong, and award-winning garden designer David Cubero were instrumental in this prestigious venture which formed the centre-piece at the Flower Show, resulting in a Silver Medal Award! By combining native plant and newly introduced species, Indoor Garden Design's Creative Director, Ian Drummond was able to create the lush, wild landscape of the highland interior of the Islands.

"We were incredibly excited to have worked with James and David on such an unusual and

dynamic project", said Ian. "The plant life of the Islands is so unique - this was more than just a garden!" This also represents another stunning example of the company 'taking their business 'outside'.

In sourcing over 25 individual species, including the branching spikes of Dragon's Blood Trees (*Dracaena draco*), the long, draping foliage of Woodwardia ferns (*Woodwardia radicans*) and the towering flower spikes of Echiiums (*Echium pinninana*), ecological considerations were paramount for the designers. James Wong says: "Indoor Garden Design were the perfect partner for our Canary Islands showpiece at Chelsea. Their experience and enthusiasm is second to none, and their innovative design skill is matched by their ecological credentials.

Planting for arts sake at Sir Elton's fundraiser

The theme of the night was modern art - to coincide with the opening of Sir Elton John's gallery space at his home in Windsor. It houses his art collection - and Indoor Garden Design were commissioned to design and install a living sculpture - inspired by the work of Jeff Koons - of a large scale replica of the Grey Goose vodka bottle (Grey Goose were the main

party sponsor. Planting for the Grey Goose living sculpture included 350 lavender plants and 150 rosemary plants.

Indoor Garden were also responsible for the under planting around the grounds - The plant material used included 550 gerberas, 275 rose bushes, 150 lavender plants and 120 grasses.
